sandra jordan prima alpaca

Peruvian prima alpaca comes from the first shearing of animals under a year old; suffice it to say, the fiber is rather rare. Under the direction of Sandra Jordan, lustrous strands are spun in situ into softer-than-so fabrics for drapery, wall coverings, blankets, and throws. The addition of a backing makes the fabrics perfect for upholstery, too, with the fiber's natural resistance to stains and pilling. The Casa de Campo collection (country house in Spanish) is, in Jordan's words, "the story of ease," as it incorporates textured weaves, jacquard-woven sheers, and blends with silk, pima cotton, and merino wool. Neutrals referencing the *caminós* (roads) of the Andes abound, but for those craving some uplifting color, there are also saturated hues. sandrajordan.com. circle 327 ➤
